

Information for Students on Scholarships and Prizes

As a student you may nominate yourself for whichever scholarship(s) you choose.

HOW: Send an email with your name, UBC student number, academic achievement and the scholarship(s) and/or prize(s) for which you would like to be nominated to the Graduate Secretary (Graduate students) or to the Undergraduate advisor (undergraduate students) in the Department of Asian Studies.

SCHOLARSHIPS: Make sure that you have taken at least 27 credits with no failed courses over the current winter session (undergraduate only). Your average must be above 75%, with no failed courses, and you must re-register at UBC for at least 24 credits in the next winter session (undergraduate only). Students registered in fewer than 24 credits in their final year of study may retain a scholarship and/or be eligible for a prize or other year-end award if this number of credits is sufficient for graduation. In this case, a scholarship may be prorated.

PRIZES: Prizes are awarded based on academic achievement at the end of a session. They may be awarded on the basis of performance in a specific course, best student in the program or for some other specified characteristic. Student needs to have at least 27 credits with no failed courses over the current winter session (undergraduate only) and average of 75% or higher for the course in question. Prizes are awarded at the end of the session and recipients are not required to return to UBC in order to receive them.

Types of Awards

For administrative purposes, funding received from all sources is divided into two major categories:

- Academic merit-based funding such as fellowships, scholarships and prizes for which the primary criterion is scholastic achievement.
- Financial need-based funding such as loans and bursaries for which the primary criterion is financial need.

Fellowships, scholarships and prizes assigned on the basis of scholastic achievement:

- Print on the student's transcript.
- Have currency for students in both their academic and professional careers.
- Require faculty recommendations provided through the academic departments or through a variety of committees managed by the Faculty of Graduate and Postdoctoral Studies (e.g. University Graduate Fellowships Committee) or by Student Financial Assistance and Awards (e.g. Entrance Scholarship Committee).
- Not all awards require or accept applications.

Bursaries assigned on the basis of demonstrated financial need to both graduate and undergraduate students:

- Do not print on the student's transcript.

- Are assigned by Student Financial Assistance and Awards which is the office of record for data related to student financial need.
- With the exception of Affiliation Bursaries, these awards cannot be applied for individually.

Financial need information is confidential and is shared with faculty only with the written permission of the student. Students who express concern to faculty advisors about their ability to fund their post-secondary education at UBC should be referred to Student Financial Assistance and Awards. Professional staffs are available to assist students to identify and access all sources of funding for which they are eligible. The University is committed to ensure that the excellent students whom UBC attracts do not withdraw solely for financial reasons.

"Award" describes a category in which scholastic achievement may be a criterion, but it is not the primary criterion. Awards recognize participation in student government, athletics, or other student activity as well as personal qualities.

- Do not print on the student transcripts.
- Are made on the basis of recommendations from the academic faculties, departments or committees.

Recommending Process

Award recommendations are made by academic faculties and departments and are assigned by either the Faculty of Graduate and Postdoctoral Studies or by Student Financial Assistance and Awards.

Both departments are responsible on behalf of the University to ensure that:

- Faculty recommendations are consistent with the "Regulations Governing Awards" as approved by the Senate and the Board of Governors.
- Faculty recommendations are consistent with the University's obligations to the donors.

Regulations Governing University Awards

The following regulations, as approved by the University of British Columbia Senate, govern all awards over which the University has jurisdiction.

1. The University does not approve student award terms inconsistent with human rights legislation.
2. Student awards issued by the University are applied to tuition and to other student fees owing. If the amount of the student award is greater than the fees, the excess is paid to the student.
3. In any given year, if invested funds do not provide sufficient income to disburse any endowed student award, payment of the student award may be reduced or withheld. The University does not guarantee the payment of any student awards other than those funded by the University. The University reserves the right to withhold student awards donated by individuals or organizations where the required funds have not yet been received by the University.
4. The Senate reserves the right to change the terms governing a student award, so that they may better meet new conditions, more fully carry out the intentions of the donor, or maintain the usefulness of the benefaction. The rights so reserved shall be exercised by resolution of the Senate duly confirmed by the Board of Governors, provided always that sufficient notice shall be given in Senate of any proposed change and that the donor or representative, if known, shall be consulted about the proposed change.

Vantage College

1. While enrolled in Vantage College, students fall under the student classification "International Program" and are not considered undergraduate students for purposes of this policy.
 - Vantage College entrance scholarships and awards are adjudicated by Vantage College on a competitive basis from among applicants who come from a variety of cultural and socio-economic backgrounds. Where indicated in the student award description, financial need may also be taken into account in the adjudication of Vantage College awards.
 - Recipients of annually renewable Vantage College student awards become subject to the provisions of this policy governing Undergraduate Awards when they progress into the second or subsequent year of their program of study and achieve regular student status.

Undergraduate Awards

1. Unless otherwise stated, student awards are tenable only at UBC (Vancouver or Okanagan Campus) and are open to Winter Session students only. Marks obtained in Summer Session courses are not taken into account in the adjudication of student awards.
2. Entrance Student Awards and Scholarships are based on a student's academic and other experience achieved prior to attending UBC. These awards are made on a competitive basis and are intended to attract the top students.
3. Continuing scholarships, prizes, or other undergraduate student awards based on academic merit will normally be given to a student who is •registered in at least 27

percentage graded credits; and •has standing in the top 10% of his/her year and Faculty or with an average of 75% or higher (with no failed courses) in the academic session on which the award adjudication is based.

4. Academic standing for students taking more than 27 credits will be determined on the basis of 27 percentage-graded credits to be chosen in a manner most advantageous to the student.

5. A recipient of a student award may retain the honour of an award but resign the monetary value. Any funds thus made available will be made available to another eligible student.

6. Recipients of undergraduate continuing and renewable scholarships, prizes, and other merit-based student awards based on academics normally are expected to be registered in 24 credits to retain their scholarship. Scholarships are offered only to those who continue their studies to the satisfaction of the Registrar. Students registered in fewer than 24 credits in their final year of study may retain a scholarship and/or be eligible for a prize if their Faculty or School confirms this number of credits is sufficient for graduation. In this case, a scholarship may be prorated.

7. Students who have completed at least one year of study at UBC may be eligible to defer certain student awards for one year, provided they show satisfactory reasons for postponing attendance. Requests for deferment must be made to Enrolment Services. Students wishing to take up a student award deferred from a previous year must advise Enrolment Services by July 1.

8. The University recognizes that students may encounter opportunities or circumstances that could result in a request for deferred admission. Applicants intending to commence the first year of a degree program may request a deferral for one year (or two years in cases of mandatory military service). Students who have been granted deferred admissions will automatically have any scholarships or other merit-based awards deferred until they begin their study at the University.

Students who are granted permission to defer their admission and therefore their student awards, will still have to satisfy any conditions of the Admissions office, such as completion of courses in progress, maintenance of a satisfactory admission average, and graduation from secondary school. They must apply to take up the deferred offer by the application deadline of the following year. They must register in the program and at the campus to which they were admitted or will be required to reapply and compete with the new applicant pool for a space.

9. Scholarships and other student awards awarded for achievement in a specific Faculty or discipline or intended for students studying in a particular program are normally conditional upon the recipient continuing studies in the same discipline or program during the following year. A program change to an ineligible Faculty or discipline will usually result in reassignment of the award to another student.

Graduate Awards

1. The fellowships and scholarships offered, unless otherwise stated, are available only to support students engaged in full-time study and/or research leading to a degree at the University of British Columbia and will normally be paid only if the recipient is registered as a full-time student at the University during the payment period.

2. Students offered both a major university graduate fellowship funding (Killam Doctoral Fellowship, Four Year Doctoral Fellowship, University Graduate Fellowship, or Affiliated Graduate Fellowship) and external funding for full-time study and research at UBC will be required to accept the external funding. If the value of the external award funding is less than the value of the major university graduate fellowship, the student will receive the difference between the major university graduate fellowship and external award funding.

Definitions

For the purposes of this policy and in all other policies in which they are not otherwise defined:

Academic Award shall mean a student award where academic achievement is the sole criterion under consideration.

Bursary shall mean a student award given on the basis of assessed financial need. Any student award that takes financial need into account is never indicated on a student transcript.

Continuing shall mean a student award given on the basis of merit, academic or otherwise, demonstrated by the student in the course of studies at the University.

Entrance shall mean a student award given according to criteria including merit demonstrated by the student prior to commencing studies at the University.

Fellowship shall mean a student award given at the start of the academic year to a graduate student primarily based on academic achievement and/or research ability/potential.

Medal shall mean a non-monetary student award, normally given near the end of the academic year based on academic merit.

Merit-based shall mean that a student award is given based on academic or other merits.

Need-based shall mean financial support given to a student based on financial need. Any student award that is based on financial need is not indicated on a student transcript.

Non-academic Award shall mean a student award where neither financial need nor academic achievement is the sole criterion under consideration. (e.g., a student award given on the basis of non-academic merit, or a combination of academic and non-academic merit, or a combination of merit-and need-based criteria). Non-academic awards are not indicated on the student transcript.

Prize shall mean a student award given to a student to recognize academics and/or achievement of the academic year that has just ended.

Scholarship shall mean a student award given to a student on the basis of academic achievement, usually disbursed at the beginning of the academic year.

Student Award shall mean any type of financial award or assistance that is given to students by the University or by donors through the University.

PRIZES for 2016 – 2017 academic year

01245 ATTARIWALA-DLEY Prize

A \$950 prize has been endowed by the Attariwala and Dley families for a student majoring in Asian Studies, and demonstrating excellence in Punjabi language and/or Sikh studies. It is awarded on the recommendation of the Department of Asian Studies.

01260 C. K. CHOI Prize in Buddhist Studies

A \$650 prize has been endowed by the Choi family for an outstanding graduate or undergraduate student with high standing in Buddhist studies. It is made on the recommendation of the Department of Asian Studies in consultation with the Faculty of Graduate Studies where appropriate.

01388 CANADIAN Asia Pacific School Society Leadership Award in Asian Studies

A \$700 academic leadership award has been endowed for a student majoring in either Asian Area Studies or Asian Language and Culture. The winning candidate will best exemplify combination of academic excellence and leadership with active involvement in the undergraduate community life of the Department of Asian Studies. The award is made on the recommendation of the Department of Asian Studies.

01204 COMMUNITY Prize for Chinese Studies

A prize of \$100 has been endowed by Mr. Lum Lai and other members of the community interested in Chinese Studies. This prize is made on the recommendation of the Head of the Department of Asian Studies, to a student majoring in Chinese language or in Asian Area Studies with emphasis on China.

01206 COMMUNITY Prize for Korean Studies

Two \$550 prizes has been endowed by contributions from several members of the community interested in Korean Studies provides for students studying the Korean language or Korean history. The award is made on the recommendation of the Head of the Department of Asian Studies.

01318 COMMUNITY Prize in South Asian Studies

A \$250 prize has been endowed for a graduate student specializing in South Asian Studies. The award is made on the recommendation of the Department of Asian Studies, in consultation with the Faculty of Graduate Studies.

01208 FUNG Hang Memorial Prize

A \$75 prize has been endowed in memory of the late Fung Hang by his family and friends. Fung Hang, who passed away July 1, 1983 will always be fondly remembered by his family as a loving and caring husband and father. The prize is awarded to an outstanding student in History of early China (ASIA 320). The award is made on the recommendation of the Faculty.

00180 Peter HARNETTY Prize in Asian Studies

In celebration of the 50th anniversary of the Department of Asian Studies, an annual prize of \$1,500 has been endowed by UBC alumnus and Professor

Emeritus, Dr. Peter Harnetty, to recognize the student graduating with the highest marks in a major in Asian Studies. Dr. Harnetty was one of the original faculty of the Department of Asian Studies when it was established in 1961. The recommendation is made by the Department of Asian Studies.

01179 INDIA Club Prize in Asian Studies

A prize of \$500, donated by the India Club, is awarded to a student in the Asian Studies Department, with particular interest in Hindi or Sanskrit courses. The award is made on the recommendation of the Department.

01376 KHYENTSE Foundation Award for Excellence in Buddhist Studies

Awards totaling \$1,000 are offered by the Khyentse Foundation to recognize undergraduate or graduate student achievement in Buddhist Studies, especially expertise in the classical languages of Buddhist traditions. Awards are made on the recommendation of the Department of Asian Studies and, in the case of graduate students, in consultation with the Faculty of Graduate Studies.

01201 KONARAK Prize in South Asian Studies

A \$550 prize has been endowed to promote excellence in South Asian studies. It is made, on the recommendation of the Head of the Department of Asian Studies, to a student who completes a major in South Asian studies with excellence or to a promising graduate student in South Asian studies. It may be withheld if no suitable candidate is available.

01229 August LARSON Memorial Prize in South Asian Studies

A prize of \$250 has been endowed by Alice Larson and Joanna Larson Lehmann in memory of August Larson who had a lifelong interest in the history and culture of Asia. The award is offered, on the recommendation of the Head of the Department of Asian Studies, to a first or second year student writing the best course essay on some aspect of South Asian history or culture. Instructors in anthropology, Asian studies, history, political science, religious studies, sociology, or other departments may nominate candidates, or students may submit essays directly.

06418 Nicki MAGNOLO Memorial Graduate Prize

Prizes totaling \$500 are offered by family and colleagues in memory of Ms. Nicki Magnolo, an alumna (B.A. 2001 in Asian Studies), graduate student and teaching assistant in the Department of Asian Studies who passed away in 2004. The prize is awarded on the recommendation of the Department to a graduate student who has worked as a teaching assistant in the Department.

01288 MALWA Brotherhood and Friends Society of Canada Prize

A \$300 prize has been endowed by the Malwa Brotherhood and Friends Society of Canada for the study of Sikh history, religion or culture, or Punjabi language or literature. The award is offered to an undergraduate student and is made on the recommendation of the Department of Asian Studies.

01235 Kenji OGAWA Memorial Prize in Japanese

A \$125 prize is awarded on the recommendation of the Head of the Department of Asian Studies, to an undergraduate or graduate student

demonstrating outstanding achievement in the study of Japanese language. Mr. Ogawa, in whose memory the prize has been endowed by his students, friends and relatives, was a highly admired and inspiring teacher of Japanese in the Department of Asian Studies, 1963 to 1970.

01358 Harmandeep Kaur RAI Memorial Prize in Asian Studies

A \$500 prize is offered in memory of Harmandeep Kaur Rai, UBC Arts alumna (2000) and graduate of the Asian Studies Department, by family members including her younger brother, Ralinder Singh Rai. The award is made on the recommendation of the Department of Asian Studies to a student in the Department, with preference for those studying South Asian language and culture.

01170 Ajaib S. SANGHA Prize

A prize of \$1500 has been endowed through a bequest from the late Ajaib S. Sangha. The prize is awarded to a student in Asian Studies with a particular interest in the area of Indic languages. The award is made on the recommendation of the Department.

01181 Mr. and Mrs. Tsutae SATO Prize in Asian Studies

A \$75 prize, endowed by Mr. and Mrs. T. Sato, is awarded to the outstanding student in the first year Japanese. The award is made on the recommendation of the Department of Asian Studies.

01211 UNIVERSAL Buddhist Temple Prize

Five prizes of \$300 each have been offered by the Universal Buddhist Temple for the best essays submitted on the topics of Buddhist philosophy, Buddhist history and Buddhist art history. Three of the prizes can be awarded to Buddhism courses at the 200 level and two prizes to be awarded to students with top essays numbered at the 300 level. The awards are made on the recommendation of the Department of Asian Studies.

SCHOLARSHIPS for 2017-2018 academic year

01251 Jaswant S. BERAR and Sham Kour Berar Memorial Scholarship

A \$700 scholarship has been established by Ab, Sodi and Vic Berar in memory of their parents. The award is made on the recommendation of the Department of Asian Studies to a student demonstrating proficiency in the study of Sikh scriptures, Sikh history, Punjabi language and Punjabi literature.

04862 CANADIAN Chinese Help Care Society Graduate Scholarship

A \$500 scholarship has been endowed by the Canadian Chinese Help Care Society. The award is offered to graduate students pursuing the study of Chinese literature or culture and is made on the recommendation of the Department of Asian Studies in consultation with the Faculty of Graduate Studies.

01324 Timothy Martin CANFIELD Memorial Scholarship

Scholarships totaling \$900 have been endowed by friends and family in memory of Timothy Martin Canfield, a student of Asian Studies who died at

the age of 24 in 1988. The scholarships are given to undergraduates in the Department of Asian Studies who are specializing in Japanese language and/or culture. The awards are made on the recommendation of the Department of Asian Studies.

06519 Velma T. and Lawrence G. Y. CHEN Graduate Award in Asian Studies.

A \$875 award is offered, in memory of Velma T. and Lawrence G. Y. Chen, to a graduate student in the Department of Asian Studies whose research focuses on China. The award will support a student who plans to undertake fieldwork and short-term research stints in Asia; attend conferences, workshops and short courses; attend intensive language training courses, or the like. The award is made on the recommendation of the Department of Asian Studies in consultation with the Faculty of Graduate and Postdoctoral Studies.

01203 GOEL Scholarship in South Asian Studies

A scholarship of \$400 has been made available by Dr. and Mrs. D. P. Goel in memory of her brother, Mr. Om Prakash Agrawal. The award is made on the recommendation of the Department, to a student majoring in South Asian Studies (preferably in Hindi, Sanskrit or other languages of India).

01321 Rosa Wai Wai HO Scholarship in Asian Studies

A \$550 scholarship has been endowed by family and friends in memory of Rosa Wai Wai Ho for an undergraduate student in Asian Studies. The scholarship is awarded on the recommendation of the Department of Asian Studies.

01112 William L. HOLLAND Scholarship

A scholarship of \$700 is offered by faculty members in the Department of Asian Studies to undergraduates or to graduate students specializing in Asian Studies. It is awarded on the recommendation of the Head of the Department to a student whose academic record and achievement show promise of a successful career in the Asian Studies field. The scholarship is named after Professor Holland, the first Head of the Department of Asian Studies.

06420 INTERNATIONAL Buddhist Society Graduate Scholarship

A \$10,000 scholarship is offered by the International Buddhist Society to an outstanding graduate student pursuing a masters or doctoral degree in Buddhism Studies. In the case of two exceptional candidates, two scholarships of \$5,000 may be awarded. The award is made on the recommendation of the Department of Asian Studies in consultation with the Faculty of Graduate Studies.

04452 LOTUS Light Charity Society Mu-Shu Lee Memorial Scholarship in Buddhist Studies

One Scholarship of \$1,000 is offered by the Family of Mu-Shu Lee to recognize outstanding academic achievement in Buddhist studies at either the undergraduate or graduate level. Candidates must be Canadian Citizens, Permanent Residents or convention refugees with proof of status. Recommendations are made by the Department of Asian Studies, and in the case of graduate students in consultation with the Faculty of Graduate

Studies.

01108 Chris LIN Memorial Scholarship

A \$1,600 scholarship has been endowed in memory of Chris Lin, who died tragically on August 31, 1966. Chris was the son of Professor Paul Lin, for many years the Director of the Centre for East Asian Studies at McGill University, and an alumnus of the University of British Columbia. Chris was born in the United States and brought up in China. He was a second year student at UBC at the time of his death. He was a fine, warm-hearted human being and a student of great promise; had he lived he would undoubtedly have greatly contributed to the furtherance of understanding and friendship between China and Canada. The recipient of this annual scholarship is a student, undergraduate or graduate, who meets the following criteria: (1) proficiency in Chinese equivalent of at least one year of intensive language study, a concentration in Chinese studies, and academic excellence, (2) evidence of social concerns and good citizenship; commitment to the study and understanding of cultures and values. Preference will be given to Canadian citizens and permanent residents, but others are also invited to apply. Candidates should submit a curriculum vita which includes a brief statement concerning their intentions and life goals to the Chris Lin Memorial Scholarship Committee, c/o Department of Asian Studies, University of British Columbia. The award is made on the recommendation of the Department of Asian Studies.

01273 Harcharan Kaur MANN Memorial Scholarship in Punjabi Studies

A \$325 scholarship has been endowed by Bikar Singh Mann to honour the memory of his late Harcharan (Swarno) Kaur Mann. The award is made on the recommendation of the Department of Asian Studies to a student studying Sikh scripture and Punjabi.

00588 Elizabeth Tong NG Memorial Scholarship in Asian Studies

This scholarship of \$500 is awarded to an undergraduate student entering the final year in the Department of Asian Studies on the basis of both academic ability and financial need. The award is made on the recommendation of the Department.

01180 OKAMATSU Family Scholarship for Japanese Studies

Four scholarships of \$1,200 each have been endowed as a memorial to his parents by Mr. Yoshihisa Okamatsu and members of his family, Kuniko, Akemi, Tadashi, Chieko, Hironori, Kuninori, Yoshihiko, Saori and Jooji. It is awarded to students studying the Japanese language at UBC. Mr. Okamatsu is a private citizen who has long been interested in furthering cultural relations between Japan and Canada, as well as other countries. Previously, he gave to the University a collection of Japanese handmade paper, and on 11 November 1977, he established this scholarship as a means by which he hopes that people in both countries might draw closer together in the cause of world peace and understanding. In April 1978, Mr. Okamatsu made a supplementary gift that brought the fund to its present value.

01248 Bruno PETZOLD Memorial Scholarship in Buddhism and Japanese Studies

A \$2,650 scholarship has been endowed by Mrs. Liesel Petzold in honour of her father-in-law, Dr. Bruno Petzold (1873-1949), who served as a professor at Tokyo Daiichi Koto Gakko, the present Tokyo University at Komaba. The scholarship is awarded on the recommendation of the Department of Asian Studies to a student majoring in Japanese or Asian Area Studies who has an interest in Buddhism.

06530 Dr. Lakhbir K JASSAL Graduate Travel Award in Arts

Two awards of \$750 each are offered by Dr Lakhbir K Jassal, to graduate students whose focus of study is in one of the following areas: Human Geography, Anthropology (socio-cultural or medical anthropology focus), Asian Studies, and Asia Pacific Policy Studies (thesis option). The awards are available to assist students with expenses associated with fieldwork or presenting their work at conferences. Candidates must have an excellent academic record, with financial need taken into consideration. The awards are made on the recommendation of the four respective departments, in consultation with the Faculty of Graduate and Postdoctoral Studies, alternating between the Departments of Geography and Anthropology in even-numbered Winter Sessions and the Department of Asian Studies and the Institute of Asian Research in odd-numbered Winter Sessions.
